



- Minutes from December 6, 2022 Meeting
- Chair Commissioner Chamberlain called the meeting to order at 6:45 pm.
- Treasurer Commissioner Holmes requested attendees to Pledge of Allegiance.
- Chair Commissioner Chamberlain called for Roll Call introduction of Commissioners.
 - Chair Commissioner Chamberlain, Secretary Commissioner Tyree, Treasurer Commissioner Holmes, Commissioner Dodley and Commissioner Johnson were present. Vice Chair Commissioner Moynihan and Zoning Chair Commissioner Marshall were excused.
- Approval of November 1, 2022 Meeting Minutes
 - Chair Commissioner Chamberlain asked Commissioners to review November 1, 2022 Minutes which resulted in no modifications. Chair Commissioner Chamberlain made a motion, which was seconded, to approve November 1, 2022 Minutes. Roll Call Voting resulted in unanimous approval.
- Zoning
 - BZA22-161 6316 Tussing Road. Ryan Weadler presenter. Chair Commissioner Chamberlain opened a question and answer session of which all issues were satisfactorily addressed. Secretary Commissioner Tyree made a motion, which was seconded, to approve BZA22-161. Roll Call Voting resulted in unanimous approval.
 - Z22-033 1555 McNaughten Road. Jeff Brown and Joe Thomas presenter. Chair Commissioner Chamberlain, using completed speaker slips, facilitated a question and answer session of which all issues were satisfactorily addressed. Commissioner Dodley made a motion, which was seconded, to approve Z22-033. Roll Call Voting resulted in unanimous disapproval of Z22-033.
- Bylaws Motion for Proposed Modifications
 - Chair Commissioner Chamberlain read, as Commissioners followed, bold outlined proposed Bylaws modifications of which Commissioners agreed. Chair Commissioner Chamberlain made a motion, which was seconded, to approve Bylaws as modified on December 6, 2022. Roll Call Voting resulted in unanimous.
- Chair Update – Chair Commissioner Chamberlain
 - Proposed, along with other resources, to have December food give away.
 - Reminder to attend hourly Greater Eastside Coalition Youth Violence Zoom speaker meetings on announced Thursdays.
 - Involved with City of Columbus and East Columbus Business Association in dealing with panhandling and homelessness. Suggested giving donations to legitimate resources.
- Community Update - Lynne LaCour, Neighborhood Pride Center Manager and Neighborhood Program Specialist
 - Gave recognition to Far East Area Commission for advocating I70-270 and East Broad Street roadway improvements.
 - Interviewed Mayor Ginther by local media showed some talking points of 2022 Eastland Plan being funded in 2023, development, growth, affordable housing and crime.

- Hired Patrice Allen Brady, formerly a City Planner, by City to Coordinate Eastland Planning efforts.
- Voted by City Council to object renewal of Queen of Hearts liquor license.
- Cancelled December 2022 Community Pride Team Meeting due to Holiday: Will resume January 2023.
- Reminded of Zoom 2022 Area Commission Training Series on Leading Civil Conversations on Saturday, December 10, 2022, 10am – 11:30 am. Training will be open to the Community and City Staff.
- Officer John Brown , 14 Precinct Liaison Officer, Division of Police, City of Columbus – Updates forwarded to Chair Commissioner Chamberlain to present.
 - Provided update summary of criminal statistics and emphasized increase in motor vehicle thefts. Stressed a reminder to communities. With cold weather, advised not to leave warming cars unattended.
 - Responded to gun run at Walnut Ridge High School. Search produced no gun. School took administrative action.
 - Gave nuisance abatement warning notification status.
- New Business
- Treasurer Update – Treasurer Commissioner Holmes gave Lynne LaCour, Neighborhood Pride Center Manager, a completed semi-annual budget report, noting \$180.03 spent, to deliver to Department of Neighborhoods.
- City Council Update – Stanley Gates, II, Direct of Community Engagement, City Council
 - Thanked Commissioners for Thank you card.
 - Informed of planning times for Council to have future talks with communities about Capital Budget.
 - Planned to be involved with Warming Centers and to link resources. Warming Centers will be fully staffed and have security.

 - Chair Commissioner Chamberlain made a motion, which was seconded, to adjourn. Chair Commissioner Chamberlain called for Voice Voting which resulted in unanimous approval. The meeting ended at 8:51 pm.

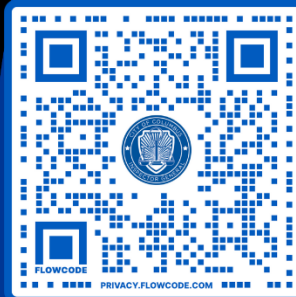
